- 4. Be objective, understanding, and fair in academic performance and relationships.
- 5. Strive toward academic excellence, improvement of skills and expansion of professional knowledge.
- 6. Encourage and assist colleagues in the pursuit of academic excellence.
- 7. Not denigrate the work of colleagues and professors and the program orally, in writing, nor in social media.
- 8. Neither engage in, assist in nor condone cheating, plagiarism or other such activities.
- 9. Foster and support sound education and research to assure the proper direction of the profession and the program.
- 10. Contribute interest, support, and leadership towards and general improvement of the community, with special emphasis on delivery of health care, medical education, and related objectives.
- 11. Observe universal precautions so as not to acquire or transmit any infectious diseases.
- 12. Respect and protect the rights, privileges, and beliefs of others.
- 13. Respect personal and medical confidentiality as a sacred trust.
